
Greetings all,



RARA Repeaters

Both repeaters (146.610 and 147.000 (both have a pl 114.8)) will function with both digital and analog radio signals, but the repeaters require time to determine whether the signal is digital or analog. To operate the repeater properly you must first be sure the frequency is clear, then key and hold the microphone button down for 1-2 seconds. Then begin speaking. If you fail to do this, the first part of your message will be lost.

Meters react to two hams...each carrying a 1.5 kW transmitter into the building.




Yes I am running just 4 watts, although I suppose I do have an above average antenna system.

Ammo Box Radio Go Box Challenge

The Challenge:

To design a HF/UHF/VHF self-contained and interally powered radio go box using one of the two ammo boxes shown.


The concept of this type of go box is that it would be a grab and go ham shack. A quick and easy setup when you might have only minimum time to react, lack of structures or trees to deploy antennas and still provide quality communication services to a community in need.

Rules:

- All radio components, support gear (including chargers and converters) and batteries must fit within the box. Antennas and solar panels can be externally carried.
- 2. All components (including antennas) must be off the shelf items that can be bought at a store or on-line (list part numbers and source).
- 3. The system needs to be compatible with 120v, 12v and solar power sources.



- 4. A basic wiring schematic and equipment placement diagram to prove concept must be provided.
- 5. A basic deployment diagram showing antenna and optional solar panel location is required.
- 7. Stats on minimum and maximum power required during operation, along with the projected run time just off the internal battery.




Large Box The lid is removable.

Ham Radio Glossary

Acid core solder-Solder wire which uses LSD in the center, as a flux.

Admittance- A characteristic of a radio amateur who acknowledges his mistakes.

Autopatch-The process of refurbishing sheet metal on vehicles.

Anti-static strap- A conductive strap, tightly worn around the mouth of a quarrelsome person.

Amplifier- A circuit which magnifies signal strength, that has reached combustion temperature.

Continuous wave- Uninterrupted kindred gesturing.

Desense- A French phrase refering to pennies.

Desoldering- Removal of grassy turf.

Dielectric- A mode of expiration by means of electrocution.

Distributed capacitance-Capacitors handed out to a group.

Ground Plane- Metallic chip like substance from recycled aircraft.

Ground radials- Recycled tires.

Guy wires- Support cables of male orientation.

Half-wave- A salutation from a person not especially exuberant.

Ham Band- A musical group comprised of amateur radio operators.

Heterodyning- A meal attended by both sexes.

Kilocycle- A two wheeled vehicle, in which is hidden illegal drugs.

Main lobe- Beer gut.

Ohmmeter- One who eats ohms.

Over sampling- A phenomena that often takes place at ham pot luck dinners.

Packet Radio- A transceiver that comes in a very small envelope.

Rectifier- A painful phenomenon that occurs when the lowest section of the lower intestine reaches combustion temperature.

Rise time- A period of awakening, often extended the morning after Field Day.

Semiconductors- Subordinate attendants on domestic passenger rail services.

Slow scan television-Television that won't quickly change channels.

Speech clipper- A source of interruption at a radio club presentation.

Spread spectrum- The entire range of semi-solid foods applied to bread and toast.

Tracking generator- A complex machine that produces steel rail.

Transistor - A sister that used to be a brother

Transponders- Those who have traveled across very small bodies of water.
