




RARA Repeaters

Both repeaters (146.610 and 147.000 (both have a pl 114.8)) will function with both digital and analog radio signals, but the repeaters require time to determine whether the signal is digital or analog. To operate the repeater properly you must first be sure the frequency is clear, then key and hold the microphone button down for 1-2 seconds. Then begin speaking. If you fail to do this, the first part of your message will be lost.

Bring a non-programmable calculator.

Ham Radio Podcasts

For one reason or another I hadn't been active for several years when I discovered podcasts on my computer. I listened to several podcasts from around the globe talking about everything that I was interested in including computers, Linux and a whole host of things. Then Leo Laport, one of the guys I listened to, started the TWIT network and then a podcast for ham radio called Ham Nation. I got hooked. From that I found Amateur Logic and when I decided to go for my Extra I found several websites that provided practice tests for all of the licenses.

Though I found apps for my phone that had and gave you a practice test for the different licenses, the one I found that I liked the best was Hamstudy.org. The site is free, and it is supported by Icom. I liked it for two reasons. First, if you missed a question, you could click on it and get an explanation, and though I was using the Extra Exam book from the ARRL, it was much easier and faster to go to the answer provided by the test. Also the way the questions were handled by the test worked the best for me, because the questions I would miss would be repeated in later practice tests until you knew them. This did a couple of things. It actually would make me study harder because I seemed to be stuck for a while right at the point where I might or might not pass the exam.

Though I seemed to be stuck just above the passing point when I went for the test, I passed with more points than I needed. The ARRL and QRZ among others provide practice tests as well. I've been an Extra for 7 years now so they may all work in about the same way.

Ham Nation and Amateur Logic podcasts are both well produced podcasts with good video as well as voice available. I rarely see the live cast of Ham Nation, and I've never seen the live presentation of Amateur Logic though I've watched both now for several years. I like to get them on ROKU. It just makes it easier then on the computer. By the way, if you want to see video from a computer on the web, I recommend the ROKU. To find out how to repair almost anything just use it to go to YouTube, and if you hunt a little you can find movies or what ever you want. On Facebook you can find the group " One Hundred Watts and a Wire" Reddit has another that my wife just told me about that is popular. I just listened to SolderSmoke.com the other day for the first time. The podcast seemed to start off slow but seemed to have a lot of meat to it after it got going. I'm sure there are several others that I don't know about. If you have a favorite, let me know and I'll pass it along.


