Member

noun - a person, animal, or plant belonging to a particular group.

Active

adjective - (of a person) engaging or ready to engage in physically energetic pursuits. Doing things for an organization, cause, or campaign, rather than simply giving it one's support.

A few times this year my president's messages have outlined opportunities or methods to be radio active. My goal has been to encourage RARA members to be more than just a club member, but to be an active member of RARA. In order for our club to continue to grow we need a higher percentage of club members to be active members. We all must step out of our comfort zone to make this a reality.

I've heard the phrases "the board should do that" or "that's the boards *job*" more than once this year. We need to get beyond just looking at the board members to plan and execute all of RARA's events or programs. We desperately need to get away from that mind set. Board members can only wear so many hats at one time before burn out sets in. There is only so many times we can play musical chairs each year at the board level with the same 5 or 6 people. The true function of the board is to help guide and encourage the club membership as a whole to participate and grow. We are here to help facilitate club members efforts in the area of programs or events that relate to RARA. This can include outreach to the general public, encouragement to new hams and on-going support for existing programs or events.

At the board level, we understand the hazard of having only a handful of people that know how to organize all of the events, programs or the functions of the club. This over centralization of knowledge is a very dangerous and potentially damaging scenario. If we were to lose just one or two key club board members chaos could result. Overnight we could lose critical skills and knowledge before it was or should be shared with, possessed or practiced by other RARA members. We as a club need to share critical club skill sets and spread the knowledge on how things

Both repeaters (146.610 and 147.000 (both have a pl 114.8)) will function with both digital and analog radio signals, but the repeaters require time to determine whether the signal is digital or analog. To operate the repeater properly you must first be sure the frequency is clear, then key and hold the microphone button down for 1-2 seconds. Then begin speaking. If you fail to do this, the first part of your message will be lost.

RARA Officers, Directors, Chairman & Program Corrdinators - Responsibilities & Openings For 2020

Nominations for 2020 Officers, Directors, Committee Chairmen, Program Coordinators and Special Event Chairmen will be made at the September 13th meeting. Nominations will be finalized and presented to club members in the October Hamrag and at the October 11th meeting. RARA club members will vote for Officers and Directors at the November 8th meeting.

If you plan to nominate someone other than yourself for an elected or volunteer position at the September or October RARA club meeting, that club member must be in attendance to accept or pass on the nomination.

I ask that all members participate by emailing me at randy@rdlgraphics.com before our October 11th meeting if you are interested in any one of these positions, or have questions about the responsibilities.

Below and on pages 6 & 7 are the general descriptions and responsibilities for each Officer, Director, Chairman, Coordinator and Special Event position available within RARA for 2020.

President (Elected November Meeting) Open In 2020

Presides at all meetings (monthly club and board meetings) according to the Rockford Amateur Radio Association's constitution, by-laws and rules of order. Appoint all committees, sign official documents and carry out the recommendations of the Board of Directors. The President is also Chairman of the Board and an automatic member of the Repeater Committee. This position starts at the January 2020 club meeting.

Vice President (Elected November Meeting) Open In 2020

Presides over meetings if President is absent. This position is also the coordinator for all of the monthly club meeting programs (selecting and scheduling programs – with input and help from the RARA Board). This position starts January club meeting 2020.

Secretary (Elected November Meeting) Open In 2020

Keeps meeting minutes (monthly club and board meetings), roll of members, provide applications for membership, and oversee amendments, changes & additions to the constitution and by-laws. This position starts January club meeting 2020.

Treasurer (Elected November Meeting) Open In 2020

Is the custodian of monies received and expended, keeping records and issuing the Treasurer's Report to the Board of Directors every month at the RARA board meeting. This position starts January club meeting 2020.

Four Directors (Volunteer Positions – must be ready at the first board meeting in 2020) All Four Positions Open In 2020

Attend monthly board meetings and are required to be current active RARA members.

The Board of Directors shall include above Officers, plus a minimum of four Directors, and current editor of the monthly bulletin (Hamrag). All four positions start January club meeting 2020.

Other Openings/Opportunities to Volunteer that should also be filled by the November 2019 RARA meeting and approved during the first board meeting of 2020:

The goal for 2020 is to have the following volunteer positions filled by RARA club members other than the elected board

members. The goal is that no RARA club member or board member will need to be in any more than one elected or volunteer position during the year of 2020. With that said any club officer or member may volunteer to be on as many committees or volunteer to help with as many events as they desire during the year. We have over 50 club members and are growing each month – there is no reason we as a club can't make this happen – step up today and help RARA.

NOTE: If we do not have RARA club members step up to fill a chairman or coordinator position, along with an adequate number of volunteers to participate in planning and to execute an event or program, non-supported volunteer opportunities will be dropped for 2020. Club member participation will determine how active or inactive RARA is for 2020 – it will be your choice and the board will support the membership's decision on RARA's direction for 2020.

RARA Volunteer Opportunities For 2020

Hamrag Editor

(Volunteer Position*) Open In 2020

Gather information, articles, photos and lay out the HamRag. Then provide a PDF file of the HamRag by the first of every month to the webmaster to be posted at the RARA website. Also, to mail out hard copies to members who have paid and requested to receive the HamRag in that form. This position starts with the January 2020 issue.

Webmaster (Volunteer Position*) Open In 2020

Maintain and update the RARA website as needed. This position starts January 1, 2020.

Field Day Chairman (Volunteer Position*) Open In 2020

To coordinate the RARA club members in the annual ARRL Field Day event. This will include creating a committee for the purpose of organizing, planning and the execution of the event according to the rules provided by the ARRL. Planning for this event is to start as soon as the chairman is approved.

September Ham Fest Booth Chairman (Volunteer Position*) Open In 2020

To coordinate the RARA club members in the annual September Ham Fest event. This will include creating a committee for the purpose of organizing, planning and the execution of the RARA booth at the event. **This is an important event as it is RARA's only source of fund raising each year.** Not only will this include setup, running and teardown of the RARA booth for the event, but during the year collect items that are donated to the club that may need cleaning or inspection. This committee will need to find volunteers to help throughout the year to make this a successful event. Planning for this event is to start as soon as the chairman is approved.

Repeater Committee Chairman (Volunteer Position*) Open In 2020

To coordinate the RARA club members in the operation and upkeep of the two RARA repeater systems. This will include creating a committee for this purpose. The RARA Board President is an automatic member of this committee. This position starts January 1, 2020.

Repeater Trustee (Volunteer Position*) Open In 2020

The Repeater Trustee is the "chief control operator" for the club station license. It is the duty of the trustee to act in the best interests of RARA, the station license belongs to RARA, not to the trustee individually. The Repeater Trustee ensures that the two RARA repeaters are operated within the repeater code as outlined by the RARA Board. The Repeater Trustee must be an active member of RARA who will follow all FCC rules at all times. This position starts Jan. 1, 2020.

RARA Offices & Volunteer Opertunities...

Ham Mentor Coordinator (Volunteer Position*) Open In 2020

To coordinate the RARA club members with Hams that request help through RARA's Ham Mentor Program. This person will be the main contact person for the mentor program. This can include creating a committee for the purpose of organizing, planning and the execution of the program or it can be coordinated by a single member. This position starts January 1, 2020.

Club Meeting Greeter Chairman (Volunteer Position*) Open In 2020

To coordinate the RARA club members to be door greeters to welcome potential, new and old members at the door during monthly club meetings. This will include creating a committee for the purpose of organizing, planning and the execution of the program. Planning for this event is to start as soon as the chairman is approved. This position starts January 1, 2020.

Monday Night Net Coordinator (Volunteer Position*) Open In 2020

To coordinate the RARA club members to be net control operators of the RARA Monday Night Net (on the 146.610 or 147.00 RARA repeaters). This will include getting members to volunteer to be net control and/or backup net control. Net to be conducted on Monday nights based on the number of volunteers available (once a month, twice a month or weekly). It is also the responsibility of the coordinator to ensure that the approved RARA net script is followed.

Annual January Awards Banquet Chairman (Volunteer Position*) Open In 2020

To coordinate the annual RARA awards banquet. This will include creating a committee for the purpose of organizing, planning and the execution of the event. Planning for this event is to start as soon as the chairman is approved. This position starts January 1, 2020.

Special Event/Program Coordinator(s)/ Chairmen (Volunteer Positions as needed*) Open In 2020

Other than the events or programs listed above – other opportunities may arise during the year or you have an idea for a program or event that you would like to see during 2020. Such as a fox hunt, special outreach, special event that you think RARA should be a part of. Step up and make your case to the RARA board and volunteer to be the chairman. As the chairman, your duties will include creating a committee for the purpose of organizing, planning and the execution of that program or event.

Club Meeting Program Presenter(s) (Volunteer Positions – RARA needs 10 programs for monthly club meetings in 2020)

This is the one volunteer opportunity where any RARA club member can volunteer to do one program or as many as they would like to do during the next year. Just volunteer by letting the board know what your topic is going to be for the night, what month you would like to take and get ready to present. We would like to complete the program calendar for 2020 during the last two months of this year. That way club members can see what the programs are going to be for the upcoming year. Step out of your comfort zone, take on a club program in 2020 and have fun.

(*) This is part of all the above volunteer position descriptions:

All volunteer positions can only be filled by active RARA members and must be approved by a vote of the RARA Board. All volunteer positions answer to the RARA board and the RARA board has the final say on how a program or event is run. Any funds needed for a program or event must first be approved by the RARA board before the volunteer can commit the club to payment for outside services, fees or other items that might be needed for the program or event. It is the responsibility of all program or event volunteers to keep the RARA board up-to-date on the planning progress or execution of an event or program throughout the year as needed or requested by the RARA board.

Volunteer & Help!!!!!

The Head of the Rock Regatta is a rowing race of 5,000 meters (3.2 miles) on the Rock River, beginning at Martin Park and finishing at the YMCA. It is a sanctioned event of the United States Rowing Association, requiring the observance of US Rowing race protocol. The Head of the Rock has expanded over the past 34 years into one of the Midwest's premier rowing events with clubs also competing from as far away as Alaska. There are now over 65 teams with 2000 participants. Collegiate teams are represented, and 16 US Rowing licensed referees maintain safety and fairness of the race. The event attracts over 5,000 spectators each year.

The Rockford Regatta began in 1985 as a challenge match between the University of Wisconsin and Northwestern University. The original match was conceived by local Rockford rowers, Rob Espeseth (a U.S. Olympian) and Dennis Kaderabek. The very next year 275 athletes and 14 clubs competed in the 1st Annual Head of the Rock Regatta. The Head of the Rock has grown over the past 34 years into one of the Midwest's premier rowing events. It is a sanctioned event of the United States Rowing Association and is listed in the US Rowing Rules of Rowing as a Nationally Recognized Regatta. For at least 12 years amateur radio has been the go-to group for radio communications.

This year we are looking for at least 22 hams to participate in this event. You do not need to belong to any group or organization to be involved in this great event.

You do not need to have expensive equipment to be involved (an Ht will do) just a willingness to be involved and help no matter what the weather may bring.

This will be a great chance to not only test your equipment but also your communicating skills with other hams from northern Illinois. Bring your families along to help you out or just have them enjoy the day on the rock river.
