Secretary's Report (RARA Club Meeting October 14, 2005)

Meeting called to order by President Bill WB9MCZ at 7:11 PM. Bill asked everyone to introduce themselves before we started the meeting.

Secretary Report – Gene KA9BOD, acting secretary read the September 8 meeting minutes. There were two corrections; the name of Carl W9TQ's wife should be Mary and the call sign of Steve James KA9NPT. Gene WB9MMM made motion to accept minutes as read and 2nd by Gary K9LJN. All approved.

<u>Treasurers Report</u> – Carl W9TQ read the treasurers report for the month of September as follows. There was income of \$52.00 (sale of OTW buttons \$36 and leftover meat from picnic \$16.) Expenses of \$58.81 (telephone \$51.81 and meeting snacks \$7.) The check book balance of \$189.01, Savings balance of \$4,138.31 for ending total cash on hand of \$4,327.32. Bob WA9NTT made motion to accept treasurer's report and seconded by Chuck WB9UMC. All approved.

Old Business

On the Waterfront – Bill WB9MCZ heard from the OTW people who reported that we had a 99.7% accuracy with the money we handled in the ticket booths. OTW will cut RARA a check for \$1,576 for our efforts. (Last year RARA received \$1,325.)

<u>Banquet</u> – Sue KA9GNR will be the chairman for the banquet in January. She has looked at several places so far including Home Town Buffet, Giovanni's, Lino's and is looking for other suggestions. A couple suggestions offered were Lone Star and China Buffet. If you have other suggestions please contact Sue. She is trying to keep the price under or near \$25 if possible.

<u>Head of the Rock Regatta</u> – Wayne KA9IMX gave a report on this event. There were 17 hams that worked the event with an added bonus that 5 new people were given the opportunity for training in the morning and then put to work in the afternoon.

Boy Scout Encampment – Steve James KA9NPT, the main coordinator of the event for amateur radio, gave a report on AirCamp. There were about 5000 boys attending the AirCamp with about 40 different activities to participate in. Amateur Radio had about 20 hams staffing the radio portion using call K9BSA. The hams were from assorted clubs in Northern Illinois. About 2,200 boys came to visit and got to see ATV, PSK31, construction table, a 20 meter station and CW station. About 150 – 200 contacts were made during the event.

Gene WB9MMM showed the portable ATV equipment the Rockford group used for Air Camp.

New Business

<u>Equipment for sale</u> – Gene WB9MMM reported that he has been contacted by Marv Smith, K9RUK about some old teletype equipment that he needed to part with. Mike Gratti, N9AYI also had a 30 foot push up mast he was giving away.

<u>ARRL News</u> – Brad WW9WWW asked for input on the ARRL Audio News being run after the Monday night 8 PM net. The RARA board will be making a decision at the November board meeting to determine if the audio newsletter will continue to be run or go away. Please contact Brad or a board member with your comments.

<u>Election of Officers</u> – Gary K9LJN, Bob WA9NTT and Dave W9MG conducted the voting process for election of club officers. The nominees were: President **Shari Harlan N9SH**, Vice President **Kurt Eversol KE9NJ**, Treasurer **Carl Cacciatore W9TQ** and Secretary **Colleen Peterson KC9EWJ**.

All four positions ran un-opposed. Fred, W9WOQ made a motion to accept these nominees as the new officers of RARA for 2006 and seconded by Dave W9MG. A vote of the membership present was unanimous.

Election of Board Members – (Vote for 2) The current President Bill Peters WB9MCZ and VP Tim Peterson KC9DNN did not run for re-election and automatically step onto the board of directors. BOY SCOUT ENCAMPMENT—AIRCAMP 2005

A recent amateur radio opportunity came together during AirCamp, October 7-9, 2005. This event was hosted by Blackhawk Area Council BSA and took place on the grounds of historic WWI and WWII U.S. Army Camp Grant. The portion of the camp used for the event is currently located within the boundries of modern day NW Regional Chicagoland Airport at Rockford.

Milt Forsberg, K9QZI, of BSA Troop 7 in Champaign is trustee of K9BSA, and he allowed the hams the use of it throughout the weekend. This callsign has been utilized in previous similar situations to help promote amateur radio within the state.

Scouts could visit the code oscillator booth and try out various buzzers, sounders, blinking lights and utilize keys from early in the 20th century; a WWII tank key, oscillators from BUD, Knight, MFJ, and Heathkit A Bencher paddle was available, plus a J-38, a Navy knob hand key and a battery powered original BSA oscillator-blinking-light-sounder. In the construction area scouts could choose from a blinking LED kit, a code oscillator, or other items available to build.

Big Thunder ARC from Belvidere provided antenna arrays. A 30 foot tower with a tribander gave one station access to the airways, while another used a 40 meter vertical. The third station used a military tripod mast with sections up to 30 feet as the mid-point for a G5RV (courtesy of Jim-WB8HMD).

One of the three HF station utilized PSK-31. Typing on a computer was not a challenge for these folks. They enjoyed the interaction with people from around the world. Multiple contacts by each HF setup were made to stations both stateside and abroad.

The VHF/UHF stations could utilize the local repeaters, or simplex, to demonstrate these portions of amateur radio as well. IRLP was available locally via a local repeater through the courtesy of Tom-W9TMW.

ATV performed well during the day. Eleven year old Mikayla Auerswald, KC9HVQ, interviewed scouts as they returned from their plane rides. A monitor was in the ham radio area displaying to the crowd what was happening on the flight line during the interviews. ATV equipment and expertise was provided by members of Amateur Television Network 0f Illinois members: Gene-WB9MMM; Wayne-KA9IMX; John-KA9SOG; Dan-KC9ATR, and Mikayla-KC9HVQ.

MARC-Motorola, Schaumburg brought out their well-equipped and fully stocked communications van. Many people commented on the telescoping mast and all the equipment inside.

Members of Big Thunder, ATN-ILL, MCWA, Mallard Lake Wouff Hon Society and MARC helped in setup, operation, and take down. Steve, KA9NPT, his wife Janice

So now the computer is powered up, radio going, and a bunch of kids asking questions. What do you do

now? I just turned up the volume so they could hear PSK31. I also pointed out the words coming across the screen.

That really got the ball rolling. This even got the Scout Masters attention. Soon I had my Macro reprogrammed for "CQ JOTA", and had a reply in no time. I asked if any of the kids wanted to type some questions, but I found out that many of them were too young or too shy to type. So they asked all of their questioned, and I typed for them. We were using Mix W for the program, which allowed me after a few QSO's, to do some in RTTY, computer aided CW, and then in SSTV. Slow Scan Television really got there attention.

After receiving a picture, they wanted me to send one. I asked if I could take a picture of them, and send it. The Cubs loved the idea, so I got out my Digital camera. In no time we were in business. Sending pictures back and forth. With the various modes, we con-


