The video for the meeting is from the ARRL Audiovisual Library entitled "Everything you wanted to know about antennas, but were afraid to ask". We have seen this one before, maybe 4 years ago, but it has been requested to be shown again by several people. I reviewed it the other day and enjoyed it so much I viewed it a second time. It is 1 Hour 8 Minutes short. The presenter has a transmitter set up on, I think, 1.2 GHz and has antennas to show that some of us have never Seen. At that frequency they are not very large and by using tone that is generated by the transmitter and a portable dipole on the receive antenna, the antenna patterns can easily be visualized.

HAROLD "HARRY" CARTWRIGHT, WB9PBO, SK

"Harry Harold Cartwright, 81, passed away in his home Jan 21, 2008, after a courageous battle with lung cancer. He was born in Thebes, IL. He spent most of his life in Rockford moving here with his family in 1939. He was a paratrooper in the 11th Airborne Division in World War II. He was a 32nd degree Mason, a volunteer election judge for 12 years and past president of the Rock River Valley Radio Club (CB club).

He worked briefly for Sundstrand and then moved to National Lock as a journeyman machinist. He was an avid photographer and consistently produced striking imagery. Learning radio theory while in the Army, he augmented his income as a part-time repairman for Johnson-Guler.

Harry enjoyed debate and was known for his often cutting political commentary. He recently retired to Mountain View, Arkansas and enjoyed his last days watching nature from the porch of the cabin that he shared with his wife of more than 50 years.

Services were Friday, January 25, and interment is in Norricks Chapel Cemetery, Mountain View, Arkansas. Harry was accorded Masonic Rites and Military Honors.

There is over 6000 different products and services listed with over 59,000 separate reviews. Let's say you are looking at a used mobile VHF radio. Click on "VIEW MORE REVIEWS" and then click on the "Transceivers VHF/UHF Base/Mobile" category. Scroll down the page listing all the radios until you find the model you are interested in. Click on the model and you will see all the reviews on the radio. But remember, these are only opinions about the radio, so use your judgment wisely. Just about anything you are interested in buying is in the product reviews category, both new and used equipment. Anyway, if you have a little time, go to www.eham.net and do a little surfin'.


Exams will be held in the St Francis Room (just right of the front entrance after you enter).

- 3. Two forms of Identification with your signature on them. One must be a picture ID (drivers license, passport, school ID, library card, credit card, etc.)
- 4. Test Fee \$14.00 cash or check. (please make checks payable to W5YI-VEC)






