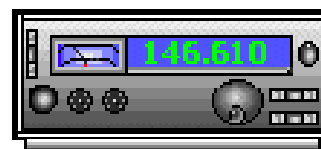

## Secretary's Report



### RARA Club Meeting May 8, 2009

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 PM by our Vice President, Steve Thorne, K9LLI. There were 22 Hams in attendance.

#### Secretary's Report:

Al, KD9CA, reported that the minutes were published in the May Ham Rag and said there were copies available if anyone needed one. Gene, KA9BOD, made a motion to accept the minutes as published and John, N9OTC, seconded the motion. The motion carried.

#### Treasurer's Report:

Steve, K9LLI, asked AL, KD9CA, to read the treasurer's report since Rich, K9PK, would not arrive until later. Al read the treasurer's report dated March 31<sup>st</sup> through April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2009.

#### Old Business:

Steve asked if there was any old business to discuss.

John, N9OTC, took the floor and said that Gordy had asked him at the April meeting to head a committee to review the Rockford City Ordinance that restricts antenna structure height and design. John said that John, KC9IED, and Jim, KC9GOL, and himself comprised that committee. He reported their findings were that the Rockford City Council had copied another city's ordinance in its entirety and apparently did not have any idea of what they passed.

Steve asked that John, N9OTC, review this information with the committee and devise a plan of how to take this forward. Who should RARA see? Dave, W9MG, suggested we fill out a petition to the City Council. John said he will report back at the next meeting.

Steve, K9LLI, reported that a Chairman for the Breakfast in the Park was still needed. The event is to take place on June 13<sup>th</sup> and will be cancelled if we do not get a volunteer by the Board meeting on May 26<sup>th</sup>.

Chuck, K9SAN, volunteered to be the Chairman and Chuck, AB9KA, offered his assistance. A discussion followed and Al was asked to read the Board minutes regarding the food budget for Breakfast in the Park. Al reported that the food budget for this event is \$175.00.

Steve began a short discussion on D-STAR. Shari, N9SH, said we must be sure that changing to a D-STAR repeater will not require us to be re-coordinated. She said if the repeater was moved, then for sure we would have to re-coordinate.

Steve reported that John, KC9IED, still needs 4 or 5 volunteers for the Rockford Marathon held on May 17<sup>th</sup>. He also needs some volunteers to assist at the Logli stores with the programming of the Midland Weather Radios that they are selling.

### New Business:

Kurt, KE9N, spoke about Field Day.

1. There will be 3 stations unless someone else wants to have a station. This will give us a 3A designation.
2. Brad Ambro, N9EN, will have a station for 40 & 80 meter CW, and Kurt, KE9N, will have a station for 40 & 80 meter SSB. Gene, KA9BOD, will have a station for 20 meter SSB.
3. Kurt asked Bob, WA9NTT, if he could take pictures for the event.

Kurt pointed out that extra points were available for the following:

- 100 points for attempted media publicity
- 100 points for holding Field Day in a public place.
- 100 points for having a public information table.
- 100 points for having an elected official visit the event.
- 100 points for having a representative of an Agency visit the event.
- 100 points for conducting Ham training at the Event.
- 100 points for copying the ARRL Field Day Message

Kurt will also have 2 computers available with a DOS logging program named CT and will provide instruction to anyone who wants to become familiar with CT.

Jim, N9VJ, then gave a presentation on matching a Vertical Antenna using solutions by computer /graphic programs.

Dave, W9MG, made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:55 PM and John W9JGO seconded the motion.
