Musings on Batteries

There seems to be a fair amount of interest in rechargable batteries lately. The interest revolves around the inability of the manufacturers to keep up with the current demands needed by the various equipment makers. Even the wire services have had articles concerning the problem. (Chicago Tribune about a month ago)

Supposedly Nokia is delaying their latest phone offering because there is no battery available to power it properly. The demand "on" time can't be met. Battery chemical systems used today are mostly old technology. The carbon zinc D cell was invented in 1898 while the Nickel Cadmium (NiCad) battery was invented in 1896. The first NiCad was very expensive and leaked. Its practical use was delayed 50 years while the leakage and cost problems were over come.

Battery makers have tweeked and tweeked over the years however today's systems need a major break through and none seem to be on the horizon. The possible answer may be mini fuel cells which are a few years off.

In spite of these elemental issues there has been some additions to rechargeable battery offerings that may be of interest to HAMS who use loose AA batteries, particularly Nickel Metal Hydride (NiMH) types. The batteries are now available in current ratings up to 2500 MAH. In addition some lesser current models can be recharged much faster, in some cases 15 minutes.

I drove around Rockford to check on what was available and for what price. I found Menards and Lowes to have the best selection. I have also seen NiMH batteries for a good price at Woodmans.

There are different chargers offered that include batteries. One that interested me was the universal model made by Energizer. It charged AAA, AA, C, and D. In addition they had a model for use in your car.

I encourage you to read the information on the package carefully. Note where they are made before making your purchase. As far as I am concerned made in Japan trumps anything from China.

Having sold various brands of batteries for 25 years I am partial to the Energizer and Duracell brand. I have seen just about all brands leak, so check them regularly.
