Attendance will be subject to how the weather is that day. Summary of the RARA JOTA demonstration on July 18, 2008

RARA operated JOTA from Alpine Park Shelter #1 in Rockford, IL on Saturday, October 18 from 10AM to 4 PM. We set up the following stations: Robert, KC9ICH operated PSK31, RTTY and slow scan TV on 20M using a dipole, Kurt, NE9J and Steve, K9LLI operated 40M and 20M phone and Dave, W9MG provided a vertical for them, Chuck, AB9KA demonstrated APRS, Don,W9DRR and Joe, K9PJJ operated 2M/440, Rich, K9PK demonstrated Fox hunting and had some keys/oscillators for CW, Carl, W9TQ was there for general info and training, John, KC9IED was available to discuss ARES, Bob, WB9NTT took pictures and Dick, KC9BCB monitored the refreshment area of coffee, lemon aide and cookies.

There were about 7 scouts and 3 scout leaders that signed our log representing 3 different troops.

Robert, KC9ICH used the new HRD/DM780 program which allowed him to operate the various modes of PSK31, RTTY and slow scan. He was able to make several contacts in each mode. Kurt, NE9J and Steve, K9LLI operated on 20M and 40M phone and made about 6 contacts on each band, all stateside. A couple of the scouts got to talk to one of the contacts.

Chuck, AB9KA set up a nice demonstration of APRS. He had a Google earth satellite view of the park on a laptop computer and a backpack with a station that allowed us to see him move around the park. Don, W9DRR and Joe, K9JPP were able to catch the ISS as it passed over but were unable to make contact. Several of the boys got to hear the exchange. Rich, K9PK demonstrated fox hunting with his VK3YNG fox hunt Snifter and tape measure beam and 3 hidden transmitters. Several of the scouts enjoyed this exercise. Rich also brought a straight key and an iambic key each connected to an oscillator and a sheet with the letters and code so that the scouts could see what it is like to send morse code. The scouts had a ball.
