

Antennas, for small places

I've been thinking a lot recently about the problems many of you have living in an HOA or apartment. The other thing is a small lot. There are a number of antennas that you can use in these situations, and there are a host of ideas that can be found on the internet particularly on YouTube. Europe has provided a number of good ideas as well as hams here in the US. I found a couple of podcasts from England where they talk about the "small garden" which is apparently what they call a small yard in England.

Here are some of the ideas that I've read about that you might consider. For a small yard you might consider an NVIS (Near Vertical Incidence Skywave) antenna. NVIS is an antenna used by the military because it is low to the ground, and the idea is it shoots a signal almost straight up so that the signal comes back to earth within about 300 miles or so. The podcast I watched showed an end fed antenna that was set up between 6 and 10 feet above the ground which gives a signal almost straight up. This was one of the "small garden" recordings that showed the antenna following the fence around the yard. The pod caster showed what to use for a ballun and demonstrated how well he was able to get a signal out.

Another antenna to consider for a small yard is a vertical. There are a variety of different vertical antennas to consider from the home made to the commercial variety. I used a Hustler 5BTV vertical back in the late '60s early '70s. At that time it covered 80, 40, 20, 15, and 10 meters, but now it covers some of the newer bands as well. The only counterpoise I used was the coax that ran into the shack some 50 or so feet away. I was only running about 60 Watts on cw at the time with a terrible receiver, but I still managed to get most of the country plus Canada, Mexico, Alaska, and Hawaii all on 80 M which was the only band I could hear on that receiver. Vertical antennas are good for DX if you have good radials on them.

One of the antennas I found was the Moxon beam. This beam is shorter than most, and can be made of wire. The interesting thing about the Moxon is that it can actually beat out a two element beam in some ways because it has almost no signal going to the back. If you look around you will find a free program on the web to figure out the dimensions for beam. Basically, you just put in the size wire or tubing that you are going to use, and the frequency that you want to build it for, and the program will give you the dimensions.

I remember when I first moved here, and set up the radio in the garage. I ran a short lead to the antenna tuner and two wires with clips on the end to the gutters that ran along the front and the back of the house. I still have a QSL card from a guy in Georgia that said he couldn't believe what I was using for an antenna. I don't think he stopped laughing the whole time I talked to him on 80 Meters. If you're like me, you have plenty of time to get on the air.

Enjoy yourself, and have fun!

RARA Repeater Information

Both repeaters (146.610 and 147.000 (both have a pl 114.8)) will function with both digital and analog radio signals, but the repeaters require time to determine whether the signal is digital or analog. To operate the repeater properly you must first be sure the frequency is clear, then key and hold the microphone button down for **1-2 seconds**. Then begin speaking. If you fail to do this, the first part of your message will be lost.
